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Supply, Deliver, Remove, and Replace Granular Activated Carbon at the Pi'iholo Water Treatment Plant

Project Details

The County of Maui, Department of Water (DoW) installed four (4) 30,000-pound Liquid Phase Granular Activated Carbon (LGAC) adsorbers at the Pi'iholo Water Treatment Plant in late 2014. By adding the LGAC systems the DoW reduced the Total Organic Carbon (TOC) concentrations in the influent water source. The reduction in TOC concentrations resulted in improved water quality which limited the potential for Trihalomethane Methane (THM) formation. THMs can be a byproduct when adding chlorine-based disinfection to water where elevated levels of TOC are present.

Aqueous Vets® Scope

The Department of Water advertised for bid a turnkey LGAC service solicitation from qualified LGAC service providers in August of 2017. The bid required that the service companies perform turnkey LGAC services which included the removal, disposal, replacement of 120,000 pounds of LGAC, and then commission the LGAC system for return to service.

The DoW received three bids from industry incumbents and AqueoUSvets® (AV®). AV was the lowest responsive bidder, therefore offering the DoW significant cost savings over the previous
